### AMENDED MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE WISCONSIN JUDICIAL COUNCIL MADISON, WISCONSIN May 17, 2024

The Judicial Council met at 9:30 a.m. on May 17, 2024 in Room 328NW.

I. The Roll was taken and the March 15, 2024 Minutes were approved.

The first order of business was to discuss renewal of our efforts to receive funding for the Council. Attorney Adam Plotkin, chair of the Budget Committee, discussed how the budget study would proceed. He announced that the Budget Committee would consist this year of Margo Kirchner, Sarah Zylstra and Bill Gleisner. Plotkin noted that a budget proposal must be submitted to the State before the Council's full meeting on September 20, 2024. Plotkin promised meetings of the Budget Committee throughout the summer of 2024 in preparation for submitting a budget before our September meeting.

Justice Hagedorn addressed the budget and the difficulties which the Council has faced in recent years. Justice Hagedorn graciously offered to discuss the work of the Budget Committee before the budget request is submitted in September.

Reports were then delivered by the Chairs of each Council Committee:

- A. Ms. Margo Kirchner, Chair of the ad hoc Committee on the "Council Corner" (a monthly report to the State Bar on the work of the Council) reported on work performed to date, as well as proposed new articles.
- B. Tom Shriner, Chair of the Council's Standing Committee on Evidence and Civil Procedure, reported as follows: 1) Work continues on revisions which have been made to Wisconsin's rules concerning injunctions; 2) With the help of Professor Blinka and Professor Schwartz, Work also continues on revisions to Wisconsin's Rules of Evidence.

- C. Judge Thomas Hruz, Chair of the Council's Standing Committee on Appellate Procedure, delivered a report on the work completed by his committee to date.
  
- D. Judge Dugan reported on the work of the Criminal Procedure Committee. Judge Dugan and Judge Gasiorkiewicz also reported on the latest developments concerning DAR reporting. Both Judges Dugan and Gasiorkiewicz reported that they would be meeting with the Director of State Courts to plan a joint effort to address DAR.
